



## FINAL DETERMINATION

DATE ISSUED AND MAILED: January 17, 2018

IN RE: *David Kneller v. Schuylkill County*, OOR Dkt. AP 2018-0246

Upon review of the appeal filed with the Office of Open Records (“OOR”) to the above-referenced docket number, it is determined that the appeal is deficient for the reason(s) specified below. Accordingly, the appeal is **DISMISSED**.

- Appeal filed beyond fifteen (15) business days of denial/deemed denial.
- Appeal failed to include a copy of the Request and/or agency Response.
- Appeal failed to state why records are public records or address agency grounds for denial.
- OOR lacks jurisdiction over agency from which records are sought.
- OOR lacks jurisdiction over local agency criminal investigative records.
- Request does not seek records.
- Other: Appeal is premature. Request dated January 30, 2018. Agency has 5 business days to provide a final response or until February 6, 2018. Appeal filed on February 9, 2018. OOR allows three days for receipt of a response through U.S. Mail pursuant to Section IV(C)(5)(b)(i) of the OOR Procedural Guidelines. Appeal may be filed within 15 business days after agency response or 11:59:59 p.m. on February 9, 2018, whichever comes first.

Within thirty days of the mailing date of this Final Determination, you may appeal or petition for review to the Schuylkill County Court of Common Pleas. 65 P.S. § 67.1302(a). All parties must be served with notice of the appeal. The OOR also shall be served notice and have an opportunity to respond according to court rules as per Section 1303. However, as the quasi-judicial tribunal adjudicating this matter, the OOR is not a proper party to any appeal and should not be named as a party.<sup>1</sup>
